Treasurers Report

I am pleased to present our audited accounts for the year 24-25.

As you will see we ended the year at an £836.74 profit thanks to our annual fundraising event at the end of March. Although it didn't raise as much as last year it still allows us to have a healthy budget going forwards.

The Highland Council budget for our Community Council remains fixed again at £493.03.

We are now paying a monthly fee in bank charges of £4.25, this is fortunately offset by the interest we get on our fundraising account.

From the monies raised this year we purchased some new football posts for the village green, we are grateful to the Highland Council for their additional grant funding towards this project, and we provided some new play equipment for the new toddlers group at the Village Hall.

We plan on spending more money in the next financial year in order to make our Community an even better place to live based upon community feedback.

We again shared the costs of the Armistice Wreaths, with more groups this year, meaning we all pay less by sharing the postage.

Thank you also to Loch Insh for taking all the bookings for the Seniors Festive Lunch and providing such an excellent day, and also to Balavil Estate for sponsoring the drinks again.
