### 5. Reports

- 5.1 Treasurer's Report. The Treasurer reported a Net Loss of £884.71 this month made up of website webwork, Armistice Day Wreaths and donation to Community Hall repairs. The closing balance is £13,135.15 as of 29/9/25
- 5.2 Repairs Update. IA reported that the bridge at Feshiebridge was going to take longer than expected due to its condition and may involve scaffolding. No further update on Tromie Bridge.
- 5.3 Police Community Liaison Report. No report issued. Reference was made to the speed of some vehicles passing through the village. JM reported the same at Insh. Police need to reassess this issue.

# 6. Projects & Events

6.1 MacBean Road Bridge Adoption by Highland Council. Having believed the road had been adopted by HC, Joan Knox representing the MacBean Residents Association believed this not to be the case. The state of the adjoining fence is in need of repair but there was doubt over who owned it. In the circumstances, it maybe better to remove it. DK suggested a meeting take place on site between Highland Council, MacBean Residents Association and K&VCC members to establish and formalise ownership of the road, fence and footbridge. Action: JK to organise

IA has not heard back regarding pothole repairs

IA noted HC have not erected 20mph signs at Insh Church as originally agreed

- 6.8 Remembrance Sunday on 9<sup>th</sup> November. IA suggested contacting Police to manage traffic. An improved sound system is in place. Wreaths have been purchased.
- 6.9 Seniors Festive Lunch, Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> December. Arrangements in hand. Sponsor for drinks to be found
- 6.10 Community Clean Up. Cancel dates during winter due to lack of daylight. JF suggested Clean Up during the day to involve local children in October 2026
- 6.11 Next Fundraising Night, 7<sup>th</sup> March 2026. SL suggested people put themselves forward or up for auction to carry out a task for members of the community
- 6.12 BT phonebox, Feshiebridge. K&VCC now officially own the phone box. Contract received. <u>Action:</u> <u>IA to look over the state of the phone box and put forward recommendations for its maintenance going forward</u>

- 8.4 Alvie Estate Car Park beside Insh Church. IA raised the issue of campervans and vehicles staying overnight and the consequence of no available toilets. A lengthy discussion took place with regard to offering alternative solutions to parking in general with accessible toilets. Much of which would involve local landowners and other interest groups as well as the planning department. It was agreed nothing could be resolved at this meeting given the complexity of the matter and was therefore deferred to a later date.
